

Statement of Intended Spend for students in receipt of Year 7 Catch-up Premium 2019-2020



Introduction

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding to support year 7 pupils who did not achieve the expected standard in reading or maths at the end of key stage 2 (KS2). In 2018-19 we received £11,738.

Estimated Catch up Premium Income 2019/20

£12,000

How is this money being spent?

£12,000 as part time salary of extra HLTAs in English and Maths to provide withdrawal groups and support in targeted intervention with students who did not achieved the expected standard in their KS2 assessments.

This provision includes:

- Ruth Miskin Phonics Programme as part of the Ark English Mastery Provision
- Lexia reading programme and training of LSAs to deliver.
- PiXL catch up Maths resources
- Ark Maths Mastery Provision
- Additional transition days to aid literacy support during Y6-Y7 transition
- Tutor Time Numeracy Ninja Programme

Incoming Students are assessed individually on their needs.

Students entering the Academy below the expected standard in English are assigned to either a Lexia provision (two sessions a week for students with a reading age of below 8years) or more intensive literacy class depending on their starting point.

Students entering the Academy below the expected standard in mathematics have targeted intervention within the Maths Mastery scheme and specific targeted intervention with a HLTA for specific areas of need.
