How to join the Online Learning



Your password is the same password you use to log into the school laptops.



You will already be assigned to your class in your "Teams".




These are your class' "channels"; they are grouped by subject and there is a resources folder for any help guides, letters, or school information that you may need.

Make sure you have a pen and some paper to work on or make notes





Please make sure your microphone and video are off throughout the lesson

CONDUCT

It's important to remind your child that despite being at home, the same level of behaviour and conduct exists as if they were at school. Encourage them to remain polite and remember their manners. Position your computer or webcam in an open environment where you can monitor their activity, preferably not in a bedroom. Try to keep the background neutral with good quality lighting and sound.




COMMUNICATION

If your child is part of an online lesson, they may need support in setting up the relevant software and communication platforms in order to take part. Your school will usually provide the relevant details on how to do this however it's worth ensuring that you have some awareness of the privacy and security settings so that you know that all communication is secure. It's important to raise any concerns that you have with the school if you are unable to accommodate an online lesson for any reason.


CONTENT

Try to take an interest in your child's live lesson if you can and stay close so that you can aid them if necessary. Try to find out who is hosting the lesson, what the lesson is about and what tasks they will be set. If they are required to conduct internet searches, ensure parental controls are in place. If you're using Zoom, make sure that screen sharing is only shared with the host. This will avoid 'Zoombombing' whereby uninvited guests use the screen-sharing feature to broadcast porn or other inappropriate content.


Opening and submitting assignments




Once the lesson is over, your teacher may set you an assignment which you can view either directly from the 'posts' in the lesson channel

Trouble Shooting

This first time you log on it may be a bit slow – if it doesn't load check you have used Chrome or Edge.

Logging in at home

Students can log in at home but they will have to also enter their password. This should save after the first log in – there is the Microsoft Teams App which they can download to their PC – please contact the school if your password doesn't work.

Possible problems and their solutions

- 1. Teams isn't working (Students need to use Google Chrome or Edge or the Teams app)
- 2. Students can't edit work (they need to 'Undo the Hand in' or click on 'Edit document')
- 3. Text boxes don't work on Word online (use tables instead or type underneath the Text box)
- 4. Students can't paste pictures or words into their work (students need to press 'Ctrl and V' keys to paste pictures must be pasted in separately)
- 5. Glitches students just need to reopen their work
